St. Francis Xavier

As the current Chairperson of the parish Outreach and Advocacy Committee, Amy facilitates opportunities for parish advocacy. She continuously seeks ways to educate fellow parishioners on current day issues relative to Catholic Social Teaching. She attends, and invites others to participate in, the Social Justice conversations sponsored by the Northeast Catholic Community. She promotes parishioner advocacy by regularly sharing Action Alerts on topics like the environment, immigration, support for food production, and the death penalty. Amy keeps parishioners abreast of issues before the Maryland Catholic Conference, and has encouraged many to attend this Social Ministry Convocation. Amy's dedicated heart and persistence serves as a reminder that together we can effect change.

Service

Dan Conley, Kacy Conley, and Dan Reese St. Gabriel

The Conleys', alongside Dan Reese, organized a food pantry distribution program that began on Palm Sunday 2020 to support those most affected by Covid-19. Coordinating with the Maryland Food Bank, and organizing donations from Food Rescue, For My City, Farm Rescue, Panera Bread and individual giving, they grew the program from the initial 500 families served, to processing 5 tractor trailer loads of food each day. This far-reaching program has benefitted those experiencing food insecurity in Westminster, Essex, Dundalk, Glen Burnie, Bethesda, and other areas. While demand for food has diminished, the St. Gabriel's Food Pantry still distributes 50 containers a day 4 days a week to those in need. Dan runs his own business & is a foster dad to 3 in his family of 6. He also serves as St. Gabriel Pastoral Council Chair. Dan and Kacy are retired and spend most of their time working in the office of the Food Pantry managing the day to day operations.

Don Monahan St. Gabriel

For more than 20 years, Don has managed the Social Action Committee. He conducts interviews with neighbors-in-need requesting funds for utilities and/or rental assistance and facilitates food pantry distribution. Advocating for those in need, he has coordinated with motel management to grant extended-stays, while providing funds for rooms, and food, as needed.

Theresa Furnari St. Ignatius

Although Theresa is now a parishioner at St. Ignatius in Baltimore City, she coordinated with the Social Action Ministry of St. Pius X (her former parish) to lend her expertise as a Master Gardener to support the bio-retention garden project in the spring and summer of 2021. Theresa was instrumental in training & educating volunteers on bio-engineering construction & maintenance, and its benefits. In the many hours she dedicated to this project, she professed the Stewardship of Creation principle of Catholic Social Teaching, and encouraged others to live this principle through service. The parish is grateful for her incredible generosity of time, talent and commitment.

Joanne is an essential volunteer for the St. Joan of Arc Good Samaritan ministry. The ministry serves those in need by providing food, crisis referrals, and financial assistance for utilities and medical prescriptions. As a volunteer, Joanne directly interfaces with our clients to determine their needs and guides them in accessing government and community resources for assistance. She identifies requirements to the Parish staff and makes recommendations for emergency support for clients.

Anne Dulik serves as lead volunteer for several parish outreach ministries advocating for the marginalized and underserved in the community. She coordinates parish support of the Welcome One Emergency Shelter, which provides a safe place to sleep, meals, wrap-around services and comprehensive case management. Advocating for the men & women of Harford County experiencing homelessness ensures they are connected to critical resources needed for positive outcomes. Anne fulfills a monthly commitment to Martha's Meals - an ecumenical group of Aberdeen Christian Churches providing meals to those experiencing food insecurity. In addition, she lends her expertise to assist those in need with tax preparation within the community and her parish.

Alan Pultyniewicz
St. John - Columbia

Mr. Alan Pultyniewicz was the first President of St. John's Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Serving for 6 years, Alan did it all. He established the SVdP program and recruited a team of loyal & dedicated members, committed in their faith, to help assist neighbors experiencing financial hardship. He implemented a system that provides rental & utility assistance, grocery & gas gift cards, clothing, school supplies, car repairs & referrals to other organizations & agencies. Alan was instrumental in raising money through parish donations and fundraising events, resulting in the support of nearly 900 calls for assistance and the distribution of more than \$82,000 to those in need. Alan is also a current member, and former Grand Knight, of the Knights of Columbus and is continuously working on programs to help those experiencing poverty and other hardships.

Kathy Gross

St. John - Columbia

Ms. Kathy Gross is a social justice advocate of exceptional capability. Undeterred by the Covid-19 pandemic, she single-handedly revitalized a dormant Environmental Committee, leading the way for St. John's Green Team, which in 2 years, has rejuvenated the rain garden, stenciled storm drains, planted a pollinator garden, and worked with the local Interfaith Center Board to "green" the worship spaces and offices. In addition, Kathy is the driving force behind the Afghan team, which is working to support an Afghan refugee family of 7. The team assists the family with food & clothing, and connects them to resources for transportation, medical issues, and job opportunities.

Jeanette Middleton-Sudano

St. John the Evangelist - Severna Park

Amazing grace through works of love! As Executive Director of "Giving Back, Linda's Legacy" Homeless Drive, Jeanette partners with local organizations and coordinates over 500 volunteers to directly serve the homeless in shelters and the streets, delivering each winter over 3,000 backpacks filled with basic needs. Jeanette actively recruits and trains parish families to experience the blessing of serving together. Most recently, and extraordinarily, Jeanette's leadership has extended to Afghan Refugee Relief, coordinating efforts for material, legal, educational, religious, and social resources, as well as ecumenical events to educate the public. Having lost a son in Iraq, her pastor believes "her heart for Afghan refugees is an example of St. Luke the Evangelist's Sermon on the Plain - returning good and blessing in all situations".

St. Katharine Drexel

For many years Kathryn has chaired our social justice ministry, providing leadership for our many parish efforts in our local community and abroad. This has included weekend food bags for a local elementary school, mobilizing volunteers for a local family shelter, and coordinating support of the CRS Operation Rice Bowl.

Ronnie's heart is for the underserved. She makes & delivers lunches for residents of an impoverished neighborhood, and prepares dinner for those in need at a local homeless shelter and church. Ronnie delivers holiday gifts & food to neighbors-in-need, and makes rosaries & cards the parish provides to those in nursing homes and hospitals.

When you think of the Social Ministry at St. Mary of the Assumption you automatically think of Helene Perry. She organizes the Giving Tree during Advent, and coordinates with multiple charitable organizations to distribute donations. One of the most impactful outreach projects she did this year was to teach people who come to the local food pantry how to grow vegetables in their own backyards. Elizabeth organized a team of volunteers to visit homes and build raised garden beds. She has been highly successful coordinating with businesses and parishioners to advocate for those in need.

She regularly delivers food to homeless encampments, and is developing a monthly parish food distribution program.
